#### A word may have a short vowel sound when:

- 1. The word has just one vowel.
- 2. The word has a consonant before and after the vowel.

The vowel is long (CVCe) when it is followed by a consonant and the letter e. The letter e is silent.

<u>Grammar: Simple Present - Be Verbs:</u>

**Student's Book:** P. (18-19)

- 1. We use the Be verb in many situations and forms: am / is / are.
- 2. To make negative sentences, add <u>not</u> after the be verb.
- 3. To make questions, put the be verb before the subject: Are they bigger? You can also make questions by using a Wh-question word in front of the be verb: Who is Lin?

#### Reading Comprehension: Story "Lin's Shopping Day":

Student's Book: P. (12-15)

**Booklet:** P. (7+8)

Students should read the text "Lin's Shopping Day" and answer questions about the following points in addition to other comprehension questions about the story.

Title: Lin's Shopping Day

**Genre**: Poem

\*Rhyming Words: street - feet / hand - stand / ...

<u>Characters</u>: Lin / Dad / Bus Driver / Lin's Teacher (Mr. Brown) / Mom / Police Officer / Mail Carrier.

Students will be provided with an <u>unseen passage</u> and they will answer comprehension questions related to the text.

### <u>Learning Strategies: Understand Character:</u>

Student's Book: P. (16)

A <u>character</u> is a person in a story or poem. You can learn about characters by what they say or do.

Students understand the meaning of the word "trait" and describe what traits does Lin have: (nice, helpful, friendly, busy).

#### Writing: Describe a Person:

(The test will be on Tuesday Oct. 7th during the English classes)

Student's Book: P. (20+21)

Booklet: P. (11+12)

Students will be asked to write a paragraph describing a person. Study this section using the <u>Writing Notebook and the Booklet</u>.

On October 7th, students will take a writing test. They will look at a picture and write four sentences to describe a person, using the verbs is, am, and are correctly. A word bank will be provided.

Please do not let your child memorize a paragraph at home. We want them to write their own sentences based on the picture.
