|--------------------------|---------------------------------------|--|
| will will not (won't) | to show certainty | I will visit my friend this weekend. |
| going to | to talk about future plans | I am going to read a book. |
| shall | to offer or suggest | Shall we go to the park? |
| might could | to show possibility (to say maybe) | I might bring cupcakes to the party. We could go out if it stops raining. |
