Enlightening	Giving new understanding; informative	adjective	informative	enlighten (verb)	<i>The documentary was enlightening.</i>
Current	Happening now	adjective	present	—	<i>We talked about current events in class.</i>
Events	Things that happen, especially important ones	noun	happenings	—	<i>The news channel covers local events.</i>
Situation	A set of conditions happening at a moment	noun	circumstance	situational (adj.)	<i>The reporter explained the situation clearly.</i>
Cruelty	Behavior that causes pain or harm	noun	brutality	cruel (adj.)	<i>The article spoke against animal cruelty.</i>
Justice	Fair treatment and the right thing being done	noun	fairness	just (adj.)	<i>The judge worked to bring justice.</i>
Rude	Not polite; disrespectful	adjective	impolite	rudely (adv.), rudeness (noun)	<i>It is rude to talk during someone's speech.</i>
Inconsiderate	Not thinking about others' feelings	adjective	thoughtless	inconsiderately (adv.)	<i>Posting rumors online is inconsiderate.</i>

Empathize	To understand someone's feelings	verb	understand	empathy (noun), empathetic (adj.)	<i>News stories help us empathize with victims.</i>
Attitude	The way you think or feel about something	noun	mindset	—	<i>A reporter needs a fair attitude.</i>
Announcement	A public statement giving information	noun	notice	announce (verb)	<i>The school made an announcement about the event.</i>
Misleading	Giving the wrong idea or impression	adjective	false, confusing	mislead (verb)	<i>The headline was misleading.</i>
